## <u>Financial Assistance – Landowner Cost-Share Programs</u>

## NRCS Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) <u>Tree Mortality / Forestry Program</u>

- Parcel Size Eligibility: 3-acre minimum; 4 dead trees/acre
- Funding Percentage: apx. 50% cost share
- Work Covered:
  - o won't cover work in defensible space zone
  - dead tree removal
  - thinning of understory and existing trees, mastication
  - o reforestation
- <u>Timeline</u>: Three funding periods for FY2017
  - funding would start in January
- <u>Funding Availability:</u> \$4 million available statewide, but will be competing with southern counties who have experienced more tree mortality thus far

## CALFIRE CA Forestry Incentives Program (CFIP)

- Parcel Size Eligibility: 20-acre project minimum (can combine four 5-acre neighboring parcels)
- Funding Percentage: 75-90% cost share
- Work Covered:
  - o won't cover work in defensible space zone
  - o RPF writing forest management plan
  - forest health practices, but can potentially include non-merchantable dead tree removal
  - o thinning of understory and existing trees
  - o reforestation
- <u>Timeline:</u> Applications accepted and funded on an ongoing basis
  - once application is submitted, it takes about two weeks to get a completed contract. Then, RPF must complete management plan and environmental reviews before work can begin. This often takes at least a month or two, depending on RPF availability
- Funding Availability: plenty available
